



SVG: Number 2 for Top 10 Cinematic Beaches in the World

St. Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG) has placed number two in the top ten list for cinematic beaches in the world.

The Tobago Cays beach of Petit Tabac, which featured in the 2003 block-buster movie "Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl", was the only beach in the Eastern Caribbean to get on the list.



The beach, located in the Southern Grenadines, came second to Phi Phi Leh, Thailand, which was filmed in the 2000 movie "The Beach", starring Leonardo DiCaprio.

Pirates of the Caribbean Parts I and II were filmed in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, going on to reach record-breaking box office revenues, with part three (At World's End, 2007) following suit and a fourth currently being filmed in Hawaii.
