

Ambassador Lee Departs SVG

Kingstown, ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES: His Excellency (H.E.) Leo Lee, current resident Ambassador of the Republic of China (Taiwan) to St. Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG) has completed his Diplomatic posting after two years and three months.

Prime Minister, Dr. the Hon. Ralph Gonsalves, made the announcement in Cabinet praising Ambassador Lee's contributions to the excellent continuous Diplomatic relations between Taipei and Kingstown over the past 29 years.

Through the generous support of the Taiwanese government many of the infrastructure projects in SVG have been funded through their assistance.
