

Cuban Ambassador Finishes Posting in SVG

Kingstown, ST. VINCENT: Cuba's first resident Ambassador to St. Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG), H.E. Olga Chamero Trias, will finish her tour of duty at the end of September, returning back home.

Her successor has been accepted by the Government of SVG and will be named in due course.

Ambassador Trias arrived in St. Vincent on April 28, 2006, serving almost 4 and half years at the Cuban Embassy.

She is a former professor and specialist in International Affairs, indicating she will use this opportunity to complete her doctoral thesis in International Affairs.

Highlights of her tenure include Cuban doctors visiting St. Vincent, Vincentian scholarships to study in Cuba, construction of a state of the art diagnostic medical facility with haemodialysis in Georgetown, and tremendous personnel support/funding with Argyle International Airport.

Ambassador Trias thanked the Vincentian people for the warm hospitality and to the Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines in deepening its Diplomatic relations, which were established in 1992.

A dinner and reception at the Prime Minister's residence will be held this week to commemorate her efforts and time in St. Vincent by Prime Minister Gonsalves and Minister of Foreign Affairs, Sir Louis Straker.
