

First Cruise Ship for 2013 Season Visits St Vincent

Kingstown, ST. VINCENT: The cruise ship “Ventura”, which holds over 3,600 passengers and a crew over 2,500, made a stop at Port Kingstown.

The visit was the first port of call to mainland St Vincent, since the tourist cruise season began earlier this month. Other cruise liners have already visited the Grenadine Islands of Bequia, Canouan, Union Island and Mayreau/Tobago Cays.

The visit of the Ventura is the first of five the ship is expected to make, according to information received from St Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG’s) Ministry of Tourism. It is expected to return on December 9, January 6, February 3 and March 3.

The Ventura has been visiting these shores for over five years.

According to the SVG Tourism Ministry, 146 port call ships are anticipated in this season, with 29 coming to the mainland, 44 going to Bequia, 43 to Mayreau, 20 to the Tobago Cays, 9 to Union Island and 1 to Canouan.
